Teaching practice - mini + maxi lessons

Many academic job applications will require a Personal Philosophy of Teaching Statement. These statements are also frequently part of the dossier for promotion and tenure in academic jobs or for teaching awards. Further, the process of explicitly writing out how and why you teach in a particular way, (and then examining, testifying, and verifying this philosophy through teaching) can foster professional and personal growth (Goodyear & Allchin, 1998). This final project report is designed to give you an opportunity to articulate and develop your own teaching philosophy.
