

# Presentation guideline

Master's degree in environmental science and engineering

Occupational and environmental health

- Oral presentations should be concise (10-15 min).
- All group participants must speak during the presentation.
- A short round of questions from the other students and the teacher will take place at the end of the presentation.
- To address the question/problem, ensure that you have characterized the risk adequately. The following point should typically be considered:
  - a. Hazard identification  
*what hazards are present in this situation, what health risks are possible (with what degree of evidence)?*
  - b. Background information  
*Briefly explain the specific context of this situation. What protective/aggravating factors likely to affect risk are present (and why)?*
  - c. Risk assessment  
*Is the risk high or low? Is there any data on accidents/illnesses in these situations?*
  - d. Relevant regulations  
*Are there any legal provisions or rules of good practice that apply to this situation? What are they?*
- Make sure to mention the key references and publications used to prepare the presentation.
