- **Keywords:**
A list of 3-5 keywords that represent the main content of the article to improve searchability.
- **Introduction:**
Provides background information on the topic and explains the rationale for the review.
Clearly states the review's objectives and the scope of the literature being covered.
Often includes an outline of the paper's structure.
- **Main body:**
The core of the paper, which should be logically organized into sections (e.g., by subtopic, theme, or methodology, applications).
Summarizes and synthesizes the key findings of the reviewed articles.
Analyses the strengths, weaknesses, and gaps in the existing research.
Compares and critically evaluates the methodologies and results of the studies.
- **Conclusion:**
Briefly restates the main conclusions of the review.
Highlights the significance of the findings and their implications for the field.
Can include suggestions for future research.
