

## Exam Format

The exam is 30min. The students will present their chosen article for the 15min, in which a couple of specific questions will be asked regarding the presented material. The students should not present all details of the articles but focus on key aspects and how course materials relate and lead to a better understanding of those aspects. In the remaining 15mins, 3 more questions will be asked.

## Grading

The exam will be graded on a 6-point scale. 1 point will be awarded for preparing a well-organized presentation about the article. 2 points for discussing the content of the article and answering questions during the presentation well. 3 points will be awarded for answering each of the 3 questions correctly. Partial points can be awarded in each category.
